


LOGO DESCRIPTION: This logo resembles multiple crossing roads. The roads represent different countries, the arches symbolise cultures crossing were the cooperation occurs, each point represents the fusion of several cross roads and the colour shows the cooperation way.

The black and white European Cooperation Day Logo should never be used on a coloured background or in coloured publications.

The coloured European Cooperation Day Logo should never be printed in black and white and the black and white European Cooperation Day Logo should be used instead for monochrome publications.

The European Cooperation Day Logo should never be distorted. See the proportions section in this style manual.


The European Cooperation Day Logo should never be tiled, shaded or lined.

The European Cooperation Day Logo should only be used in a horizontal configuration, and always with all its elements included, image, name and claim.

For co-branded publications, the European Cooperation Day Logo should be equal in size or larger than the other logo. The European Cooperation Day logo should have the same amount of exposure.


PROPORTIONS

Trebuchet MS

TREBUCHET MS is a humanist sans-serif typeface designed by Vincent Connare for the Microsoft Corporation in 1996. Its development was influenced by other sans-serif typefaces namely Frutiger, Akzidenz Grotesk, Gill Sans or Erbar. The large height of symbols such as i/î and simple lines make it easy to read, even at small sizes. In fact, one of Vincent Connare's intentions when designing Trebuchet was to instill personality points even at small sizes while maintaining its clarity and personality.

Arial Narrow

Arial Narrow will be used as the secondary typeface for the European Cooperation Day visual identity, particularly in cases where a large amount of text is required, such as press releases or letters. This typeface was designed in 1982 by a 10-person team, led by Robin Nicholas and Patricia Saunders, for the company Monotype Typography. Arial Narrow is one of many styles that the Arial typeface comprises. The use of Arial Narrow allows us to achieve a visual display of the content which is much sharper and easier to follow, making texts, large content or alternative content fit the visual design and the main corporate typography, Trebuchet.




